DTD SUPPORTS MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS

New Resources for Delts Promote Greater Awareness, Accurate Education and Appropriate Treatment for Mental Illness

On college campuses, student mental health has become a growing concern in recent years. In an American Psychological Association survey, it was found that “anxiety is the top presenting concern among college students (41.6%), followed by depression (36.4%) and relationship problems (35.8%). However, 19% of directors report the availability of psychiatric services on their campus is inadequate.”

These statistics are alarming. They signal that college students nationwide need more mental health resources. Kenyon is no different. A 2018 Kenyon Collegian article highlighted the issue: “With only six staff members, the counselors at the Health Center are overburdened.” Delta Tau Delta National is attempting to combat this problem with additional resources available to undergraduate brothers.



In the spring of 2018, the Fraternity launched a new student benefit through a partnership with Talkspace. Talkspace makes it simple and convenient to connect with fully licensed, highly respected counselors via text, audio or video messages from your browser or smartphone—in the library, over the weekend or between classes. Undergraduate members have access to Talkspace for one month at

no cost. Talkspace is completely optional and 100% anonymous and secure.

DTD also launched its own online resource. “Delt’s Ulifeline provides access to mental health crisis resources 24 hours a day,” said Steve Paquette, former International DTD President, in an announcement. “I encourage all undergraduates and alumni to review the Ulifeline site. By knowing what tools and resources are available, we can act quickly and confidently when we recognize a brother in need. The fact that we cannot do everything should not prevent us from doing something. Ulifeline offers us the tools to do something and to seek to make every day another good day to be a Delt.”

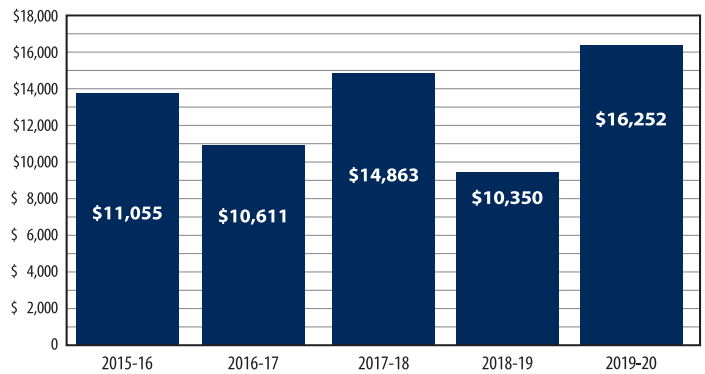

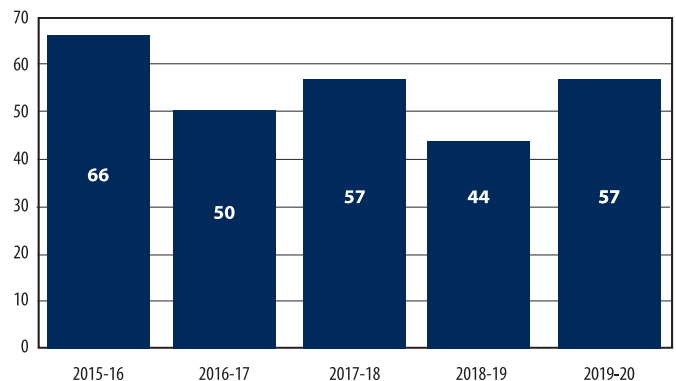
